The Kravis Leadership Institute (KLI) has partnered with several organizations to create summer internship opportunities for CMC students through the **KLI Partnered Internship Program**. Internships with partner organizations are expected to challenge interns with meaningful responsibility and leadership development as well as expose the student intern to organizational leadership dynamics.

KRAVIS PRIZE INTERNSHIPS

Established in 2006, the Henry R. Kravis Prize in Nonprofit Leadership awards \$250,000 to an annual recipient in the nonprofit sector. Every summer we send CMC students all over the world to intern with these visionary nonprofit organizations through the Kravis Prize Internships

AWARDS

The program is open to CMC students with preference given to students enrolled in the Leadership Studies Sequence and/or affiliated with KLI or the Kravis Prize. Selected interns will receive a stipend of up to \$5,000 to assist with travel and living expenses associated with the internship. All participants are required to complete the requirements of INT199: Internship, for academic credit.
